Here is some information about this term's work in Red Class

Mathematical Development: This term the children will

- ❖ count objects reliably up to 16, recognise and write numbers to 12
- ❖ say numbers to 50
- ❖ begin to combine two sets of objects and count them
- ❖ Use language to describe shape and to compare quantities
- ❖ sequence pictures and recognise patterns

Communication Language and Literacy

- ❖ blending sounds, read some familiar and common words
- ❖ identify and write initial sounds of words in a variety of given tasks
- ❖ sound out and read simple regular words
- ❖ talk about ideas and speak with increasing confidence
- ❖ learn some simple rhymes and poems
- ❖ perform plays in small groups and participate in presentations

Knowledge and Understanding of the World

- ❖ find out about our village and houses in it
- ❖ investigate materials used in building
- ❖ find out about forces
- ❖ learn about plants and how they grow
- ❖ discover a variety of foods and where they come from e.g. farming
- ❖ Learn more about Jesus and his teachings

Creative Development

- ❖ learn songs and investigate rhythms using a range of instruments
- ❖ continue to choose materials and equipment to create models
- ❖ create pictures using a range of techniques
- ❖ use imagination to create sequences of movement to music

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

- ❖ continue to learn to share, take turns and work in small groups
- ❖ in outside activities work as a team to build and explore
- ❖ improve their listening skills and learn to respond to other children's ideas
- ❖ carry out daily tasks independently

Physical Development

- ❖ learn to move with confidence, imagination and safety in dance
- ❖ learn how to play team games
- ❖ recognise how to keep healthy
- ❖ develop stamina and speed on our village walks
