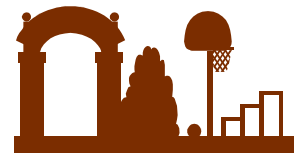


The overall winner was '**Children in Need**' for whom we raised a staggering **£285.00 !!!!**

USE OF THE NEW PLAYGROUND EQUIPMENT

You will have noticed that we now have new lines on the Junior playground and that the exercise trail and musical instruments are installed in the Vicarage playground. We are awaiting the provision of safety surfacing, which should happen on Monday, after which the trail will be available for children's use.



We will, initially, be putting into place a rota system give different classes times when they can use the trail and instruments. We are also planning that each class teacher will take their class out to show how the trail should be used safely, so all users are clear how to use the equipment in a safe and positive way.

The equipment is designed for use by **school age children in a supervised controlled environment**. This being the case, I must **insist** that before the school day and after school the school day that the equipment is not used either by school aged children but especially not by pre-school age children. I am happy to consider a scheme in which parents, once CRB checked and after safety training, are on a rota to supervise the use of the play trail for fixed times at the beginning of the day and at the end of the school day. If you are interested in volunteering to support this scheme, please give you name to Mrs Perry in the school office.

ANTI-BULLYING WEEK

As you will be aware we have been supporting the national anti-bullying week by distributing bracelets to encourage our children to speak out. Classes in Key Stage 2 were visited by PC Alderman. He worked with the classes to raise awareness of what to do and who can help if there is a problem.

I would like to take this opportunity to remind you that if you have a concern about your child in school relating to bullying or any other issue, the first action you should take is to contact your child's class teacher and make an appointment with them to discuss your concern. This discussion is usually sufficient to resolve most concerns. More complicated concerns will be escalated, to be dealt with by members of our school leadership team.

Trying to sort out concerns yourself without going through the method outlined above has, in my experience at a previous school, led to far more complicated and distressing implications for all those involved. Please trust us to work with you to resolve the concerns and issues that do arise. In many cases the issue and concerns are a normal part of growing up.



DESIGN A CHRISTMAS CARD

We like to send a Christmas Card to people who have helped us during the year. Please could children design us a card – only in black pen please with no writing on – that we could use. We need these by **1 December**. Everyone who enters will be given a copy of their own card to give to someone else.

POLICE 'WATCH' SCHEME NOTIFICATION

This is a general warning from the Police to those using vehicles to get to school and parents taking/collecting their families. There has been an incident of a parent's vehicle having side window broken and items stolen from inside whilst it was parked outside of a school whilst a parent was collecting their child.

This appears to be a very isolated incident - however police would take this opportunity to remind you that items of value, such as handbags, wallets, purses, small change, shopping, coats, private papers, CDs etc should not be left on display when vehicles are unattended. At the very least it is better to leave them out of sight in a covered boot area - but best not to leave anything in the vehicle at all.

With the festive season just around the corner vehicles do tend to be a little more vulnerable. A little time making sure nothing is left on display may prevent you becoming a victim of crime.

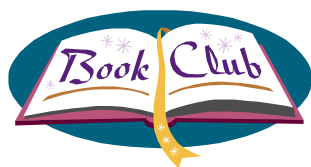
