Free EscapeLine Parent Session: Monday 6th February 3.30-4.30 (Tea and coffee provided)

This session is hosted by Escapeline, a charity committed to preventing child exploitation by criminal gangs across South West England. The term "county lines" is used to describe a form of exploitation where criminals befriend children, either online or offline and manipulate them into becoming involved in drug dealing. Young people between 13-16 are most likely to be targeted, but there are reports of as young as 6 year olds being groomed into county lines activity. The illegal drug business has been estimated to make an annual profit of more than £800,000,000 with over 50,000 young people being exploited by County Lines in England alone. Gangs target any young person, of any background, race, gender, or age. It is not just the vulnerable and disadvantaged young people or those from poorer backgrounds, with a history of abuse that get targeted. This event intends to focus on the balance between factual information by experts in the field, alongside real-life stories and experiences of those that have been exposed to child exploitation into county lines.

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On-Line Safety

The name 'Huggy Wuggy' may sound cuddly and endearing, but experts warn that children are being left frightened by the viral video game character's appearance in social media content.

The fanged monster features in the horror-themed 'Poppy Playtime', a computer game set in an abandoned toy factory. Huggy Wuggy, a blue teddy bear who sings songs about hugging and killing people, is appearing across TikTok, Roblox and Minecraft. Children in school, as young as Year 2, are mentioning this character, and this is upsetting others. We encourage you to have an open discussion with your child/ren about this character, how they know about it and the impact it has on others.
