

Weekly Update: 8th January 2021

Welcome to 2021 and yes, after much deliberation, I am going to say 'Happy new year'. I am fully aware that the start of this year is complex and stressful, the pandemic continues to disrupt and demoralise, not respecting the new year, new start, the 'happy' new year that so many had hoped for. Across all sectors, for many already drained of energy and resilience, this is compounded at organisational and individual levels by short notice expectations, a significant lack of clear information and very little effective guidance.

That said, there is a much more hope in 2021. There are vaccines, there is prior experience to draw upon, to adapt as together we face and overcome new challenges, there is light at the end of the tunnel.

So we start this year understanding it is not at all easy. Whilst it feels 'life' is locked down, not everything is cancelled; Hazel Britton recently shared this poem on Facebook:

Remote Learning Summary

- 97% of pupils are logging onto Google Classroom (Tapestry for Reception class) and engaging in learning.
- Staff have made dozens of phonecalls and sent emails to support parents and children having difficulties logging-in, accessing learning and turning in work.
- Local charities have worked with us to support access to devices where necessary.
- Most pupils will have had their exercise books delivered to them today (Children attending school have been given them in school).
- We are proud to have organised learning so that children in school <u>and</u> children accessing learning at home are receiving similar learning opportunities via Google Classroom (Tapestry for Reception class). This contributes to an equitable offer for all.
- Google Classroom (Tapestry for Reception class) has enabled increased interactivity and feedback from teachers on your child's learning-there are some great conversations going on!
- Positive feedback from pupils and parents.
- Support staff have started phoning families to check how things are going and to offer support (They aim to make contact with all families within each 2 week period).

During these unprecedented times, we all find ourselves facing new challenges. For many, this will bring about new anxieties, for others, it may worsen existing worries.

Where children and young people are affected, you may notice that they react to uncomfortable feelings and thoughts by changing their behaviours and demonstrating behaviours you have not seen from them before. In turn, these behaviours can add to an already stressful home situation.

It is important to remember that self-isolation, does not equate to social isolation.

If you are a parent/carer of a child in Somerset and would like to speak to a Psychologist with any concerns arising for you, or your family during this time, then The Educational Psychology Service is here for you. We are able to offer an initial 30 minute telephone consultation (discussion) and a potential follow up call, of another 30 minutes if appropriate.

Calls will be offered Monday-Friday, during usual working hours.

Unless the Psychologist feels that you, or someone else is in danger of harm, then full confidentiality will be respected. In order to offer the best possible service, a brief summary of the discussion will be recorded, which may be shared with colleagues from other services. If you do not wish for a record to be taken, then please make this clear to the psychologist during your call and they will only record the name of the school.
