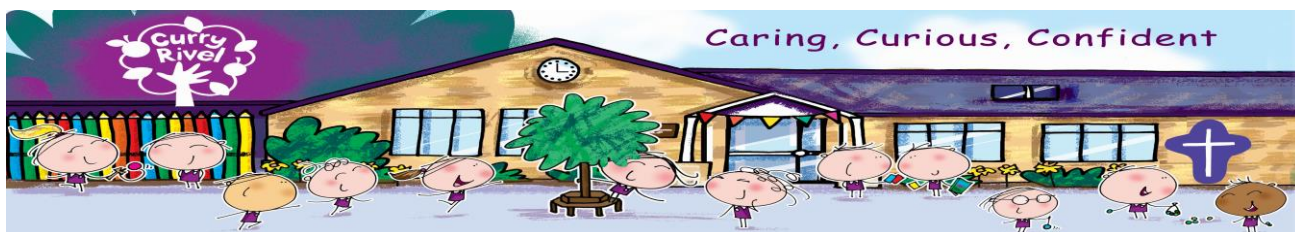

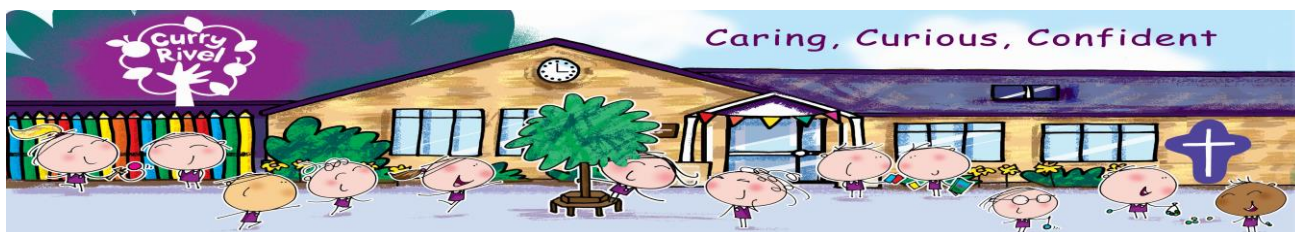

Friday 6 December from 7pm – an evening of good food, carols and other interludes in the village hall.

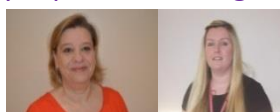
