Between chatting and gaming online, scrolling through social media, and streaming music and video, young people are almost constantly connected to the digital world in their free time. Now more so than ever: recent research identified that 77% of youngsters were spending more time online on games and apps than they did before the pandemic. One immediately obvious issue with that is – as outlined in Ofcom's Media Use and Attitudes Report 2021 – almost half (45%) of parents have concerns about their child being bullied on the internet.
