Dear Parents,

It was lovely to see so many parents and family friends at the two class assemblies that we have held. I hope you enjoyed visiting the class afterwards with your child.

Could I ask that everyone remembers the request re photos? It is lovely to have a photo to remember special occasions and so we understand that you would like to photograph your child. The general rule re mobile phones is that they shouldn't be seen when you are in the school or nursery. Some schools have gone as far as asking parents to hand them in but we think we can work together to make sure we all keep them out of sight. The exception to this is when there is a performance or special assembly when you may wish to take photos. But, to keep all children safe, we must stress that any photos taken are not shared on social media eg Facebook, as often there will be other children in the photo.

I have been really impressed with the children's understanding of the behaviour code. I hope that they are sharing their positives with you at home too. There can sometimes be a misunderstanding in communications between school and home, and if you have any queries, I do urge you to pop in and share them with us. This week, a couple of confusions have come to my attention. For example, in Pippin Class, the children were taking home picture books as well as their individual 'reader'. Although we made sure their 'readers' were changed for new books, sometimes the child chose to take home the same picture book. This is understandable as children often have a favourite.

The other question that came up was regarding homework. We don't want any child to feel stressed by their homework and the new grid of different activities has resulted in some wonderful imaginative work and positive feedback from the children. Please talk to us or send in a message if your child is struggling and we may be able to clarify what has been asked of them or how much time they should spend on a task.

I look forward to meeting with members of the PTA at the next meeting. It is great to have their support for the ipads and then we will be able to discuss what will benefit the children most for the next fundraising campaign.

Coming up soon, we have the Curry Rivel Primary Live and I look forward to the talents of the school being celebrated. We also have our very own Curry Rivel World Cup Tournament happening at lunchtimes – fun, competition and good sportsmanship are the aims! We have one final sport fixture of athletics next week and I wish them every success. A big thank you to Mrs Hardwick for organising and supporting the sports teams and for running the tournaments this term.
