## Lunches

We have been notified by our school meal supplier, Figs, that there will be an increase in pricing to take effect from September. Figs has seen ever-increasing costs from their suppliers that has affected the cost of production, whilst still ensuring they provide us with the best quality food.

The price of your child's school meal will be £2.80 for the new academic year. This will not affect UIFSM and

FSM children. We are proud to have been able to maintain the same pricing for parents since lunchtime hot meals were introduced in 2014 and please be assured that we have made every effort to keep this increase to a minimum.



#### **Special Achievements**

Mr Bridgeman took two maths teams to Huish Episcopi Academy for the STOMP challenge. STOMP is an annual maths competition for all the primary schools in the catchment area. The following children took part:

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Across the country, this year's results also show a drop in the overall proportion of pupils meeting the expected standard in Maths, Writing, SPAG and in all three subjects combined (English reading, English writing and maths) at the end of key stage 2. Given the disruption pupils experienced during the pandemic, this overall drop is something we expected to see.

However, here at Curry Rivel you will know that we have focussed our school improvement on Reading, SPAG and Maths- in all of these areas we have bucked the national trend. In the next academic year, we will be focussing our efforts to improve writing outcomes across the school.

All of our Year 6 pupils have worked very hard and they all have achievements to be proud of.

# Message from the Local Authority regarding SEND

The IP1 group from the WSOA (Written Statement of Action) SEND work are encouraging people to get involved in the SEND annual survey which closes 19<sup>th</sup> September. Different surveys exist for professionals including volunteers, parents/carers, children and young people. So far take up has been low and we would like to see more schools, including primaries helping pupils, families and staff to engage. These results are considered and shared across all the agencies involved and this year the focus is on how information is gained about lived experience and also offers a chance to share good practice.
