I hope you managed some rest and enjoyed some festivities over the Bank Holiday weekend. What a busy week back at school with Year 1 Phonics Screening, the Year 6 residential meeting, Maigold swimming, class photos, trip planning and the continued delivery of our exciting broad and balanced Curry Rivel Curriculum. We have had visits from our English and Curriculum Governors as they monitor the impact of changes and improvements we continue to make to teaching and learning.



Sports Day

Although our Sports day isn't until the 12th July, we take this event very seriously as we want this to be a special day for all our pupils and for every child to be able to participate and enjoy healthy individual and inter-house competition. Today, Mr Bridgeman, our PE leader, has worked with all the children to establish their sprint times, as this will help us ensure our fastest runners are representing their houses in the sprint races. (He has also been assessing the children's throwing and jumping skills so he can select the school's athletics team). During athletics lessons in PE, teachers will be preparing children for the huge range of sports day events (From egg and spoon, to hurdles; from tug of war to obstacle). All pupils will be competing in events on the day, and will be representing their houses. On Sports Day, we encourage the children to wear T-shirts of their house colour:

Blackdown: Red Polden: Blue Mendip: Green Quantock: White

- Reception, Year 1 and 2 Sports Day will start at approximately 9.00am (Parents/carers of R/KS1 children will be able to come to the field straight away). We expect to be finished by 11.00am.
- Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 Sports Day will start at 12.45pm, with a comfortable finish before 3.15pm.

Parents who wish to attend both events are welcome, and you will hopefully have an hour or so to pop home for lunch! We appreciate this is a big event, and you may not be able to attend both parts- we have made a deliberate decision to organise it in this way, as our Sports Day last year was a great success, with positive feedback from the children and high levels of participation. If we restrict the Sports Day to just one afternoon, we will minimise participation levels for the children.

School Uniform

A uniform creates a sense of belonging and shows pride in our school and our commitment to a shared vision, value and ethos. It helps to promote a positive and professional work ethic and encourages a focus on learning. It promotes equality of opportunity and protects our students from social pressures to dress in a particular way. It nurtures school cohesion and promotes positive behaviour.
