Can you help your child and the school too?

Can you save yourself money and get extra financial support for the school?

If your child qualifies for a Pupil Premium grant, the school receives money which we use to support visits, residential trips, assistants to give extra support, etc. Children whose parents or carers receive certain benefits may be entitled to free school meals. This also entitles the child to the benefits of the pupil premium grant for the next six years. Only the benefits listed here - and no other benefits - qualify you for free school meals for your children.

These are the benefits.

- Universal Credit with an annual household income of less than £7,400 after tax
- Income Support (IS)
- Employment and Support Allowance (Income related) not Contribution related
- Income-based Job Seekers Allowance (IBJSA) not Contribution based
- Guaranteed Element of State Pension Credit.
- Support under Part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Child Tax Credit with an annual taxable income (as assessed by HMRC) of less than £16,190, as long as the family is not also in receipt of Working Tax Credit.

If you have recently become unemployed, but are still receiving Working Tax Credits, you may be entitled to free school meals. Please phone Somerset County Council on 0300 123 2224 for advice. We have the application forms in school and can talk you through the process and benefits if that would be helpful.
