Our School Vision and Values

Collective Worship Theme: Do Justice

This term, our collective worship theme is "Do Justice," inspired by the powerful words from Micah 6:8: "What does the Lord require of you? To act justly, love mercy, and walk humbly with your God." Through stories, reflection, and prayer, we are encouraging children to think deeply about fairness, compassion, and standing up for what is right-both in our school and the wider world. By exploring justice, we are helping pupils understand how their actions can make a positive difference, fostering a sense of moral responsibility and courageous advocacy.

Our school makes a positive difference to our community through our Harvest Festival Service on Thursday 2nd October at 9.15am- you are all welcome to St Andrew's church for this service focussed on thankfulness. We encourage the children to bring dried/tinned food to donate to the Curry Rivel and Drayton foodbank.

Clubs

This term, we are pleased to offer a range of exciting clubs for our pupils, including some led by external providers. We understand this is a change from previous terms, and we appreciate your support as we explore new opportunities for enrichment. We're delighted that our Forest School Club continues to be run by our experienced Forest School Leader, Ali Moore, offering children valuable outdoor learning experiences. Please note that uptake for the netball and football clubs is low at the moment and might result in these clubs not going ahead. Looking ahead, our teaching staff will be offering clubs again during the spring and summer terms, and we're already planning a varied and engaging programme. Thank you for your continued support.

Spellings Years 3-6

From Monday 22nd September, we will be sending home a weekly list of spelling words for your child to practise during the week. The test will take place the following Monday and will include 15 words: 10 new ones based on that week's learning and 5 mystery words that revisit previous spelling rules or statutory spellings.

In this spelling book, the 10 weekly words will be stuck in at the front and their test will be recorded in the back so you can easily track your child's progress. We kindly ask that children practise their spellings at home, but not in the spelling book itself. To help with this, we have stuck in a sheet with useful ideas for how your child can practise their spellings throughout the week. Thank you for your continued support!
