Dear Parents and Carers

I hope that you are hearing feedback from your child re their learning this term. When I speak to the children, they all seem so proud of something they have achieved or tackled. In my regular meetings with the teachers, we discuss each child's progress and there are many who have made great strides forward with your help.

I have some requests to start the term off well. I hope you can help us with these!

- Please name all your child's clothes including hats, gloves, water bottles and shoes. For example, we have about 5 good quality water bottles in lost property but cannot return them as they are not named.
- Home Learning folders: we understand if one gets lost and we will replace it but when the second gets lost as well, it is expensive for us to replace it again. We will probably have to charge for us to replace it after the second loss.
- Reading records: please can these be brought into school every day. We are very fortunate to have many volunteers as well as teaching assistants who are helping readers every day. It is really important for us to record who has read and when, as well as keeping tabs on who is reading at home. For Year 5 and Year 6 children, we are developing their sense of preparation and independence by expecting them to show us their reading record every day with consequences if they are not there!
- Camera watches: a few children have watches that can also take photos. If your child has a phone like this, please can you make sure that they do not wear it or bring it into school.



And finally, my last request! Are you one of the six parents in Blenheim class that paid nothing towards the swimming last term or one of the four parents who paid nothing in Gala? Please bring in your contributions – it really would be appreciated as we need to keep these swimming opportunities going and cannot keep afloat

without every parent contributing their share.

Thank you for any help you can give us with these requests. It saves us a lot of time and supports the children in their learning.
