Parents' Evenings

Parents/Carers of pupils in Years R-5 are warmly invited to your child's parents' evening after the Easter break. We are pleased that these meetings will be 'face-to-face' and 'in person'. Parents' evenings will be held on Wednesday 19th/Monday 24th April (3.30-6.45pm). The timing of the meeting is 10 minutes, and teachers will be providing you with feedback on your child's progress. The teacher will also answer any questions you may have & you will have a chance to look at your child's work. During the parents' evenings, the school's parent-teacher association (PTA) will be providing refreshments and doughnuts in the hall where you can also view your child's books. The PTA will be hosting the book fair and selling pre-loved uniform too. House Captains will be available to take you to your child's classroom for your appointment. It is your choice whether you bring your child to the meeting- this is very much parental preference. Letters will be going out today.

Drop-Off

Due to concerns being raised about safety of families and children at the front of the school before drop off, we are going to try a different arrangement. The pavement is narrow outside the school, and people are having to step onto the road to get around queuing families, which we want to avoid. From Wednesday 22nd March, the gates will open at 8.35am and a staff member will stand roadside as usual. Parents/carers are asked to wait on the front playground:

Pippin: Queue along fence

Maigold: Queue along Maigold alleyway

Gala: Wait near Gala door, without blocking Maigold access

Discovery: Wait near Discovery door without blocking School Office access

We ask that children are not left on the playground as they will be the responsibility of parents/carers and that they also don't run around and play and that they stay by the side of their parents for supervision.

The bell goes at 8.40am, as usual, and the classroom doors will open (Maigold top gate will also open for the one-way system to flow).

The start of the school day is still 8.45am.

For the small number of families who also have children in Year 5/6, your Year 5/6 children can access their classrooms via the Discovery door. If you wish to walk them around as normal, that is fine. Arrangements for all other Year 5/6 pupils has not changed and they can access school via Water Street- the teachers are always at the gate and it is always a good opportunity to pass on messages if needed
