<u>R and KS1: Slim My Waste - Feed My Face:</u> Discover all of the benefits of reducing food waste and what to do with food waste that needs to be recycled. Meet Burpy the food waste bin and through sorting activities find out what to recycle and what happens to it.

KS2: Slim My Waste: Children develop an understanding of the range of resources consumed to supply us with food (e.g. fuel, energy, water, packaging materials) and the impact this can have on the environment. Children will learn how to reduce, reuse, and recycle food waste.

COVID Update

Early interpretation of guidance announced by the government this week:

- From September, schools will not be expected to operate and isolate in bubbles
- Post 16 August, U18's will not be required to self-isolate
