Dear Parents,

Keeping children safe online

Over the Christmas holidays, some children may spend a lot of time using the internet to play various games. Some children in school appear to be playing 'Fortnite' and it may be that parents and carers aren't familiar with possible risks from this and similar type games. In school, we talk about internet safety and we will be promoting this very strongly next term too. The following advice is available from 'webwise', a very useful website with lots of information about current trends, pressures on children, etc.

Do have a look as things change so rapidly and children may naively not know the risks they are taking - https://www.webwise.ie/parents

Risks related to Fortnite:

- 1. The biggest concern for parents of children accessing this game is screen time. Due to the immersive nature of the game, some children will find it difficult to stop playing. Games can be over in seconds or, if the user is achieving a high level then it can seem imperative to continue playing.
- 2. The PGEI rating is 12+ but age is not requested when creating an account.
- 3. The platform is integrated with Facebook and Google, the concern is that users may add other gamers to these platforms. Talk to your child about making friends with people they do not know online.
- 4. The default setting enables other online users to add you as a 'Friend'. Should you add them as a friend you are able to private chat with them.
- 5. Gamers playing this online game connect from all across the world may be any age or gender and can remain totally anonymous•
- 6. Users may be exposed to offensive language by other players on text chat or live chat.
