What a surprising end to Spring 1! I hope that you all keeping safe during the storms. It is half term and I hope that you will be able to use the week as a real break for much needed rest and restoration-many of you will still be working, but I hope you can have some precious family time. Thank you for your incredible support this half term, through supporting PTA events, encouraging your children with homework and reading and keeping abreast of events and news through these weekly updates and other communications. You have continued to support our approach to COVID, and we know that when you have had queries or worries you have communicated with us so that we have been able to help. There has been an enormous challenge of staff absence as Covid variants have spread rapidly and staff colleagues across all roles and responsibilities have been forced to isolate. Staff and governors have gone above and beyond once again to support our school, and the children and families has been phenomenal. It is such a privilege to work with so many people who give so much of themselves, heart and soul, that others might flourish.

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### **Cross Country**

A huge well done to all the children in Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 who attended the Cross Country competition at Somerton on Thursday. Joseph (Camelot) finished first in the Year 3/4 boys' race, Alfie (Blenheim) won the Year 5/6 boys' race and Lexi (Blenheim) came 2<sup>nd</sup> in the Year 5/6 girls' race. Mr Bridgeman reports that the attitude and enthusiasm from all was superb, with each child representing Curry Rivel with pride. #### Nursery Garden

The nursery garden has previously been levelled (and shored up with gabions) and now the second phase is to begin. This includes resurfacing of the garden and building of a new canopy and fence. This is very exciting, but will mean 2 weeks of disruption. Works start on the 21st February and the works compound will be on the front playground, allowing access through the front single gate to all entrances except the Pippin outside space. Pippin access will be via our front door- all other class access remains the same.

I will ensure that a member of staff opens the gate and holds it open to allow as much flow as possible. Please can Gala parents follow the Maigold one-way system and exit via the Maigold gate. The 'flow' will not be as good as usual, and I am sorry for any inconvenience that this may cause. Whilst you are waiting along the pavement, please can I remind you to wait in single file so that families can get past without having to step onto the road.

#### Message from Mr Bridgeman: Times Tables Rockstars

Times Tables are a vital aspect of a child's Maths learning, underpinning so many aspects of the subject. We feel it is important for the children to practise these on a regular basis, to improve their recall speed and aid them with further Maths learning. After half-term, we will be re-launching Times Table Rockstars as a compulsory part of the children's homework for all classes from Gala up to Blenheim. The children will be assigned the tables that their teacher feels are most important for them to practise; this will be based on learning in class as well as performance on TTRS itself. Progress will be checked on a Friday and Dojos awarded to those who have completed the task.

## World Book Day: Thursday 3rd March

Miss Tucker has been working hard to plan an exciting Word Book Day. Events will include:

- Staff and pupils to dress up as a book character.
- Literature being promoted through 'Book trailers' in a 'cinema' atmosphere.
- Raising the profile of reading in our classrooms with children recommending books they've
  enjoyed with book reviews and new book displays in very classroom.

#### **COVID** Update

After half-term, the schools' Governing Board have agreed for the school to continue with a precautionary approach to minimise the spread of COVID by retaining: Hand hygiene; extra cleaning; masks at beginning end of school day- staff and parents; staff mask wearing in communal areas; class clubs and staff LFT testing. We will be lifting some restrictions:

- Whole school Collective Worship to resume and church services
- One parent per award-winning pupil at celebration assembly (Masks please)
- Some mixing at playtimes as per Autumn 1 (ie two classes mixing at playtimes)
- Play leaders able to mix with younger children E.g. Year 6 sports leaders with younger children
