Reports and exercise books

COVID Update

In September, it is likely that we will maintain all measures to continue to minimise the risk of spread of infection- this is likely to include the wearing of masks on the playground at drop-off/pick-up.

I will keep you informed about arrangements for the new school year, including procedures we may keep as they have worked well in COVID and could support our school moving forward. Please note, that the situation is changing rapidly, and more measures than expected may be maintained in September (like bubbles).

Buying uniform

Please can you ensure your child wears **sensible**, **comfortable** shoes for school in September- these are essential for the Daily Mile and playtime activities. (Ballet style slip on shoes are not appropriate)

PE kit-we would still like children to wear PE kit on PE days. One change however- school jumpers/ cardigans must be worn on these days (Not hoodies and tracksuit leisure tops). Black shorts please (Jogging bottoms for the colder weather).

Items can be ordered via the school office. Book bags are also available at school. Please ensure that all clothing is clearly named so that we can return clothes that are found and also to help the children when they are changing. Also, especially when your child is young, velcro or elastic on shoes is much easier for them rather than laces. We also ask that every child has a waterproof coat every day of the year so that they are properly dressed for outside play.

All items must be labelled with your child's name.

Nursery Works & Premises Improvements

Mr Silver will be working over the summer to continue improving our school grounds. We also hope to have contractors coming in to update the upper school toilets (New toilets, sinks and cubicles). Most importantly, we have work being completed in the nursey garden which will continue into the first weeks of term- this is a massive piece of work to rebuild the wall against the culvert and is fortunately going to be funded by the Local Authority. This work will stabilise the ground and also enable Little Pips to have a new garden surface and design. Please be prepared for some disruption to the carpark and some play spaces early in September.
