150 Years of Curry Rivel School

There is evidence that a school was formed in Curry Rivel in the second half of the 18th Century linked to the National Sunday Schools' Movement. In 1819 the Rev. Henry Alford offered a room at The Limes, for a small fee, and local parishioners financially supported it, with 95 pupils on the roll. By 1828 the Church provided land for the increasing number of children and a building was provided: this is what we now know as the Old School Room. By 1870 it was decided to build a new school as numbers were over 100, and in 1874 a Church School, able to accommodate 150 children, was built on the site of the present school. Curry Rivel Parochial

School became a Church School and is now Curry Rivel Church of England VC Primary School and Little Pips Nursery (With The Nest Baby Room). The numbers on roll have varied over the years from 100 to over 200, with evacuees from London increasing the numbers during the 1939-45 war. Today, school and nursery admits the children from 0 to 11 years of age and presently has 140 pupils on roll in 6 classes, with over 40 children in the nursery. This year marks a momentous occasion for our village as Curry Rivel Church of England Primary School celebrates 150 years of educating local children. Since its founding in 1874, the school has been at the heart of the community, shaping generations with its dedication to learning, personal growth, and strong Christian values. Curry Rivel Primary School began as a small village school, offering basic education to local children at a time when schooling was not yet compulsory. Over the decades, the school has grown, evolved, and modernized while staying true to its core values of kindness, respect, and ambition. Throughout the years, countless pupils have walked through its doors, some of whom have gone on to achieve remarkable things in a wide range of fields. Many former students have returned as parents, teachers, or community supporters, continuing the school's legacy of lifelong connection and contribution.

While Curry Rivel Primary School is proud of its history, it is also looking to the future. With modern classrooms, an inspiring curriculum, and a focus on sustainability and innovation, the school is committed to preparing today's children for the world of tomorrow. As we celebrate 150 years of education, friendship, and community spirit, we invite everyone, past and present pupils, parents, staff, and villagers, to join in the celebrations and be part of this historic moment.
