

Weekly Update: 12th February 2021

Dear Parents/Carers,

One of the challenges blended learning has been trying to ensure a broad and balanced curriculum. We are proud that we have been able to maintain a broad range of subjects and skills for the children to learn, enriched by events like the half-term inter-house PE competition and the 'Pooky' challenge.

As a school we are on an improvement journey; to support this, the Local Authority meet with governors and school leadership to review progress and next steps every term. A recent 'Core Group' meeting was really positive with the Somerset Primary Advisors identifying many improvements in the school; they were particularly impressed by the Remote Learning provision and the impact we are making. As always, school improvement is a journey and is particularly challenging when momentum is reduced with school closure and COVID. However, we are ambitious and committed to ensuring Curry Rivel primary school is a great school for all and it is my hope that you can 'see and feel' the developments and improvements we are making. It is possible we will have an Ofsted monitoring visit in the coming months, so we look forward to sharing our progress with inspectors, and listening to their advice.

Pupil Surveys

Over 100 children took part in the Remote Learning on-line survey- brilliant. Some key figures:

- All KS1 children found the work interesting and 100% felt that had learned new things. This was 94% and 98% respectively in KS2.
- 98% of children in KS2 found the teacher feedback useful with 93% in KS1.

Increase the difficulty of the work set. This has been fed back to the teachers.


