National Safeguarding alert

We have been made aware of a national safeguarding alert about the children's books 'Spy dog/Spy Pup' and 'Spy Cat' written by Andrew Cope.

The books ask children to explore the associated website in order to find out more about characters. It appears the website (identified on the back or inside the book) has been compromised, and takes users to a highly pornographic website with no age verification.

We have checked our library and classrooms and removed all of these books if we have found any. We are asking you as a precaution to please check if you have any of these books at home and to remove them from your child's access, until confirmation is received that this issue has been resolved.
