Headship News: Message from the Chair of Governors

It gives me great pleasure to write to you to inform you that after a demanding and rigorous recruitment process the Governors have appointed Mrs. Angela Sullivan to the position of Headteacher of Curry Rivel CofE (VC) Primary School and Little Pips Nursery and The Nest.

The process was led by the Governors and involved staff and pupils as well as representatives from Somerset Local Authority and the Diocese of Bath and Wells and we were delighted that the position generated a lot of interest and a strong field.

Mrs. Sullivan is currently Assistant Headteacher at Heathcoat School in Tiverton and will bring to our school extensive experience in Primary education as a teacher and a school leader. She is very much looking forward to joining the school in January and getting to know everyone.

As part of the handover process Mrs. Sullivan will be visiting the school to meet with Mrs. Pook and members of the leadership team to get to know the school over the next few weeks.

SIAMs

We have been informed by SIAMs (Statutory Inspection of Anglican and Methodist Schools) that we have our Church School inspection on Thursday 13th November.

What Is a SIAMS Inspection?

SIAMS stands for **Statutory Inspection of Anglican and Methodist Schools**.

It's a special inspection that looks at how well a Church school shows and lives out its Christian values and vision.

What Does SIAMS Look At?

Unlike Ofsted, which focuses on academic standards, SIAMS looks at:

1. Christian Vision

How the school's Christian values guide everything it does — from teaching to relationships.

2. Worship

The role of collective worship in school life and how it helps children reflect and grow spiritually.

3. Religious Education (RE)

How RE helps children understand Christianity and other world faiths.

4. Spiritual and Moral Development

How the school helps children explore meaning, purpose, and values in life.

5. **Leadership**

How school leaders make sure the Christian vision is central to decisions and school culture.

Why Is This Important for Parents?

- It shows how the school supports your child's **spiritual**, **moral**, **and emotional development**.
- It celebrates the school's commitment to being a loving, inclusive, and values-driven community.
- It helps ensure the school stays true to its **Church foundation** while welcoming everyone.
