We are now reaching the end of September, and seemingly Autumn has well and truly made its entrance with the change in the weather and the evenings are starting to draw in. It is so lovely to see how well all the children have settled in to their new class rooms and along with the brand-new Reception year group we have welcomed some new faces amongst our fantastic staff team.

This school year the Governing Body will be working hard to further develop and embed the changes and improvements we made across the school in 2018/19. We want to ensure Curry Rivel Primary School continues to see good progress in all year groups and offer the opportunity for every child to reach their full potential in both learning and childhood development.

The most important job for the Governors this year will be recruiting and appointing a new substantive Head Teacher. Mrs Burns is doing a superb job in supporting the school through a challenging period and has committed to continue working with us as Acting Head until we have found the right person to join and lead our school. We have been working very hard developing an attractive job advert and job description to encourage high quality applicants. That advert is due to be published soon. Continuing the subject of change and new school year, I have taken the difficult decision to step down from my position as Chair of Governors. Being a Chair of Governors at a local primary school is both one of the most challenging and rewarding voluntary roles available in the community. That just leaves me to thank you all for your support over the past 18 months. I have learned a lot personally but could not have done it without all the Governors pulling together to work as a team. There are lots of exciting things to look forward to this term with residential trips to Kilve and Bristol for Key Stage 2 as well as our annual Harvest Festival. We will also be welcoming the school nurses into school on 24th October to deliver the annual flu vaccinations, which for the first time will be available to all children from Reception to Year 6; which helps protect all the children and our community from spreading nasty flu viruses around to keep everyone well.

Using Technology Safely

We agree to:

- not tell anyone else our passwords and user name apart from our parents or carers
- only search on the internet for things we have been told to
- follow school rules when using technology and the internet

To keep ourselves safe we will:

- never give out any personal details about ourselves over the internet
- never use the internet to find scary things
- tell an adult if we see something we think we shouldn't have
- be careful about the information we read on the internet because it might not be true
- never reply to messages from strangers
- ask an adult if we are unsure about clicking on a link
- turn off the screen and tell a teacher or an adult if any pictures or words make me feel uncomfortable
- never meet up with someone we don't know

Our teachers must:

- check search keywords and use child-friendly search engines
- show us how to stay safe on the internet
