UNDERSTANDING CHILD EXPLOITATION (CSE) WITH JANE WETHERILL ON 20TH MAY 2019 AT 6:30PM AT HUISH EPISCOPI ACADEMY, WINCANTON ROAD, LANGPORT

CSE is a type of abuse does not always involve physical contact and can happen on-line via posted images, webcam or text/messages. Children in exploitive situations and relationships receive something such as gifts or affection as a result of performing certain activities. Young people may be tricked into believing they're in a loving, consensual relationship and often trust their abuser and don't understand that they're being abused.

This session will raise awareness of the signs of CSE and guide you in teaching children and young people about healthy relationships.

Dear Parents and Carers,

Firstly, I would like to congratulate every Year 6 child for the positive and determined way that they approached the tests that they completed this week. Their calm and mature manner was a credit to every single one of them as the tests are very tricky and a challenge for anyone (including adults!).

Recently, we invited two county advisors to visit the school and review the teaching, talk to the children about their learning and to look at their work. Both were impressed with the calm and positive atmosphere in the school. We have received their report which includes the following:

- Pupils were consistently respectful, courteous and ready to learn. They spoke eloquently and enthusiastically regarding their work and were keen to discuss the content of their books.
- Teachers and support staff have high expectations of the pupils and a commitment to the work of their school.

There were lots of other good comments as well as suggestions for our next steps. Some of these areas we had already identified for our focus next year eg promoting spiritual awareness. I will be developing the detail of what we aim to do over the next half term and will also bear in mind the results from the different assessments.

We are pleased that the new Ofsted Framework (that will be in place in September 2019) will focus on the broader school curriculum. According to Ofsted's press release, we can expect that *'these changes will move Ofsted's focus away from headline data to look instead at how schools are achieving these results, and whether they are offering a curriculum that is broad, rich and deep, or simply teaching to the test'.*

We are delighted to tell you that Emma Myhill will be joining the staff team next week as one of our teaching assistants. Over the next couple of weeks, the assistants are going to be moving between classes a fair amount to cover the different activities such as bicycle training, cricket competitions, preparing for the phonics checks and it is an ideal time for Emma to meet everyone and to find out more about each class.

Thank you very much to the parents and carers who are sending in certificates that have been awarded outside of school. It is lovely to congratulate a child on something special to them whether it be trampolining, running, swimming, instrument exam, etc. It is really helpful if, as well as the name of the child, there are some details about the award.

Finally, a request! Please can you check that your child's sweatshirt, coat, etc is named. It takes time every lunchtime trying to match the children with the tops that they have taken off when playing. We have a lot of school tops and coats in the lost property box that we cannot rehome as we don't know who they belong to. Thank you in advance.
