Pupil Premium Allocation: £37,200

Premium Spend 2014/15

- To support an additional teacher in year 5
- Additional LSA in Year 1 for 1:1 literacy support 3 days a week
- smaller classes across the school
- small group phonic intervention in KS1
- extra LS in KS2 with PP/SEN expertise
- support for extracurricular clubs
- support enrichment activities incl cross phase work
- additional teacher with background in PP/SEN for one day a week to lead PP on trial basis. Organise small group work, and analyses impact
- Professional Development and training with a programme designed alongside Learning Network
- Supplement swimming cost including extra coach.(1 session per week)
- ELSA training of two members of staff in order to support vulnerable families
- support for breakfast, afterschool clubs and for holiday club to support vulnerable children. Initially targeted at the most vulnerable (Apple Trees)

Impact of Pupil Premium Spend 2014/15

- At end of KS2 100% of disadvantaged pupils achieved expected progress in reading (88% NA),
- At end of KS2 100 % of disadvantaged pupils achieved expected progress in writing (90% NA)
- At end of KS2 83% of disadvantaged children achieved expected progress in maths at KS2 (83% NA)
- FSM underperforming non FSM on attainment in Maths (see SEF/SDP)
- In year 1 Phonics screening 94% significantly above NA (74%)
- Phonics retakes in Year2 were 100% significantly above NA (66%)
- 100 % of pupils met their targets in year 1 and in year 2
- Attendance of pupils in the top 40% of country
- ELSA training completed and room organised and ready for September 2015 start
