COVID UPDATE

Covid out of hours - If you or your child have a COVID positive result, contact the headteacher immediately on alpook@educ.somerset.gov.uk. Leave a contact number in your message and I will respond as quickly as I can. Thank you.

For the first 6 days after teaching ends (from the 19th December to 24th December), if a pupil
or staff member tests positive for coronavirus (COVID-19), having developed symptoms within 48
hours of being in school, the school is asked to assist in identifying close contacts and advising
self-isolation, as the individual may have been infectious whilst in school. Please email the Head
Teacher. Emails will be checked once a day (in the morning). In the event of a positive case, we will
identify close contacts and we will inform the relevant people, via email, regarding self-isolation.
All families will be informed regarding any positive cases in school.

Christmas holidays: Schools have been advised that they will not need to have a point of contact for contact tracing purposes from Christmas Day until the end of the holiday period.


