Dear Parents and Carers

We have lots of exciting news to share re teachers and classes! We are delighted to congratulate Mrs Hardwick on the news that she and her husband are expecting their first child in November. She will be continuing to teach until near the time and has told her class today. They were very excited for her!

At the governors' meeting on Tuesday, it was agreed that we would expand to six classes from September. This is a sign of our popularity as many children have joined us and we have unfortunately had to turn some children away in the last year. It will hopefully mean that we can have smaller numbers in each class as well. We are looking to appoint a class teacher to start in September and this is currently being advertised.

On another note, Mr Peter Staddon has now resigned from the post of headteacher - his message to the children is below. He had been part of the school for a long time and we wish him well in the future. The governors and staff will now start the process for appointing a new headteacher. The values and ethos of the school will be at the core of any future decisions. Until a new head is ready to start, I expect to remain at the school and continue to work with such an inspiring and caring team.

Our sports teams have been busy over the last couple of weeks. We are very grateful to Mrs Rickards-Tilly for her coaching and leadership of our netballers, who came a very close second in the final of the Stoke St Gregory tournament and to Mr Drew Nicholson for organising and leading the football team who performed with such spirit against strong opposition. They were awarded the cup for 'Best Sportsmanship' and Beau-Paul was given an individual player award.

<u>Sports Kits</u>: have you got any sports kit lurking in your homes? We are missing several items including netball kits, football shorts, football socks. It would be great to have it all returned (preferably washed) so that we can ensure that the children are properly kitted up in our upcoming events.

<u>Growing up science unit</u>: as part of this term's curriculum, the children in Year 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 will be learning about how bodies develop from childhood to adulthood, and the differences between males and females. Specifically for Year 5 and 6, they will learn more about puberty. If you would like to see the resources that will be used, do ask in the office and we will show you the worksheets and DVD clips.

<u>Recorder club</u>: our new recorder club for Years 3 to 6 will start next Tuesday lunchtime at 12.15. I will be giving each child who comes to the club a recorder to borrow for the half term.

The Year 5 in Camelot and Blenheim had bicycle training recently and we are really indebted to Mrs Rickards-Tilley and Mrs Myhill for giving up their time to come and support the children. We really appreciate the time and energy that they gave as this type of activity could not take place without their enthusiastic support.

Finally, our school was chosen for research by NFER on Year 6 science knowledge and the children took part in assessments in physics, chemistry and biology this week. They should feel very proud of the comments that I then received from the representative who came to oversee the assessments: *I just wanted to say how well yesterday went. Miss Tucker had prepared the classroom so well, the children's focus, courtesy and effort were outstanding.*

Dear children


You are probably surprised to hear from me, after all this time. However, reluctantly and to my great disappointment I have had to conclude that I will not be able to return to work as your head.
