All class teachers are teachers of all pupils including those pupils with special needs- if you have any concerns, questions or queries, please contact your class teacher via the school office and they will be able to help you.

Harvest Festival

Harvest is a wonderful opportunity for all schools and nurseries to help children and young people to think about how food reaches their plates and to say thank you for all they have received, as well as giving to those in need. Our harvest festival service will take place on Tuesday 5th October at St Andrew's Church, at 9.15am. Currently, I am risk assessing the event in line with COVID guidance to enable a decision around parents/carers attending this event- I will inform you as soon as I am able. We will be demonstrating 'courageous advocacy' by supporting the important work of the Curry Rivel Foodbank, and ask that children bring dried foodstuffs (tins or packets) to the Harvest service. We would like to make a special harvest display both in school and at church- we would welcome donations of a few ears of corn, wheat or barley.
