Message from Curry Rivel Active Travel

The Curry Rivel Active Travel Steering Group has been busy behind the scenes trying to forge ahead with improvements within the village and on the route between here and Langport/Huish Episcopi. Progress has been slow due to the re-organisation of the new Somerset Council, however the group is optimistic that things may start to happen soon.

Pedestrian safety improvements within the village are still a high priority, and the Steering Group are now waiting for feedback from Somerset County Highways on the measures already proposed. They are also looking into a possible crossing over the A378 near Westfield and one near Honeylands/Parsonage Place.

This week, the Curry Rivel Active Travel Steering Group, alongside representatives from Langport, Huish Episcopi, Drayton and Aller, had a very interesting presentation from leaders of the group responsible for The Strawberry Line project. The Strawberry Line is a cycle path stretching from Yatton near Bristol to Cheddar and across Wells and Shepton Mallet. The visitors were able to share their valuable experience gained in implementing their project over the years. 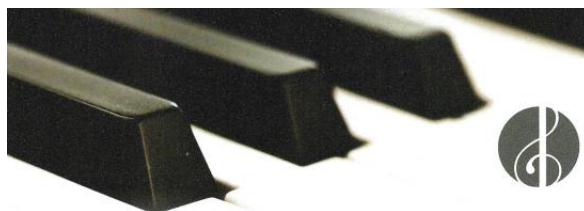
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do feel free to start gathering items using your own bags too. We will be collecting bags all through June and storing them in our shed at the back gate so feel free to drop them into school when you can.
