#### Wreath

Thank you to Mrs Spencer for decorating our Christmas Wreath. The Advent wreath is a traditional Christian symbol that helps us mark the four weeks leading up to Christmas. The circular shape of the wreath represents God's eternal love and the hope of everlasting life, while the greenery reminds us of life and renewal. The candles on the wreath each have a special meaning:

- First candle (Hope): Reminds us of the hope brought by the prophets and the promise of the Messiah.
- Second candle (Peace): Symbolises the peace that Christ brings to the world.
- Third candle (Joy): Often pink, it represents joy as we draw closer to Christmas.
- Fourth candle (Love): Celebrates God's love shown through the gift of Jesus.
- Fifth candle (Christ candle): Placed in the centre and lit on Christmas Day, it represents Jesus as the light of the world.

These symbols help us reflect on the true meaning of Christmas and encourage values of hope, peace, joy, and love in our school community.
